Public Health Internship

The Public Health Internship is available to college students to build career-ready skills in environmental public health. Duties include: Collecting and analyzing environmental samples to assess public health risks, developing communication and outreach messaging, working with local public health officials on various environmental health risks. The internship also provides for the opportunity to pursue independent research projects. The internship provides:

- 1. \$10/hour pay for work related to internship (30-40 hours a week for 8-10 weeks; water quality monitoring, aquatic invasive species research, habitat restoration, grounds maintenance on Lakeside's campus, etc.).
- 2. Opportunity to gain experience with research either by assisting with on-going projects or developing an independent project.
- 3. Room and meals at Iowa Lakeside Laboratory for the duration of the internship.

The internship runs from mid-May to early August (exact dates are negotiable).

The internship is a partnership between the Friends of Lakeside Laboratory, Okoboji Protective Association (OPA) and the Clean Water Alliance – Water Quality Commission grant.

Eligibility

The Internship is for college level students or recent graduates with majors in chemistry, biology, environmental science, or related course of study. Experience with laboratory procedures is preferred, but not required.
